

## LIEUT. DRAPER DROWNED.

Was Working at Ferry at San Antonio,  
Luzon, When He Lost His Life.

WASHINGTON, June 29.—Gen. MacArthur has cabled to the War Department the following account of the death of Lieut. Draper:

“MANILA, June 29.—Second Lieut. Paul Draper, Twenty-second Infantry, drowned morning June 28, working on ferry near San Antonio, Nueva Ecija, Luzon. Body not yet recovered. MACARTHUR.”

Paul Draper was born July 24, 1876, at Valley View, Iowa, and served with the Sixteenth Infantry as private, Corporal, Sergeant, and First Sergeant of Company D from July, 1897, to November, 1899. He was serving in the Philippine Islands as an enlisted man at the date of his appointment as Second Lieutenant of the Twenty-second Infantry, and was continually with his regiment to June 28, 1900, when he was drowned.
