

EX-GOV. F. W. HUNT DEAD.

Was Decorated for Bravery While a Lieutenant in the Philippines.

GOLDFIELD, Nev., Nov. 25.—Frank W. Hunt, who was Governor of Idaho from 1898 to 1900, died to-day.

He was in the Philippines as Lieutenant in the First Idaho Volunteers and was decorated for bravery during the campaign. He leaves a widow and a daughter.

Frank W. Hunt, fifth Governor of Idaho, was born at Newport, Ky., Dec. 16, 1861. His father was a Captain in the United States Army. Mr. Hunt was a State Senator at the age of 23 years. In the Spanish-American war he served as First Lieutenant and as Captain in the First Idaho Volunteer Infantry. He took part in the battle of Manila. In January, 1901, he was inaugurated Governor of Idaho.
