To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

**Whereas,** There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Blackfoot Idaho Territory, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure Homesteads to actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Solomon W. Tremelling has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the south west quarter of section fourteen in township fifteen south of range forty three east of Boise Meridian in Idaho Territory containing one hundred and sixty acres

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General.

Now know ye that there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said Solomon W. Tremelling the tract of Land above described: To have and to hold the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Solomon W. Tremelling and to his heirs and assigns forever; subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws, and decisions of courts, and also subject to the right of the proprietor of a vein or lode to extract and remove his ore therefrom, should the same be found to penetrate or intersect the premises hereby granted, as provided by law.

In testimony whereof, J. Benjamin Harrison, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
